A.1.2 UNIQUE ASPECTS OF THIS RFQ:

1. This solicitation is for a Firm Fixed Price Purchase Order with two, 100% one-year option periods as follows:

CLIN 0002AA - OPTION PERIOD 1: UP TO 366 DAYS AFTER AWARD
CLIN 0003AA - OPTION PERIOD 2: UP TO 731 DAYS AFTER AWARD

The Government reserves the right to exercise the options in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) clause 52.217-4001, SEPARATELY PRICED OPTION FOR INCREASED QUANTITY, included in Section I of this RFQ.

2. The Government's packaging requirement adheres to Military Specification MIL-STD-129, Revision P - Change Notice 4 and MIL-STD-2073-1, Revision D, including Notice 1 and uses Special Packaging Instructions (SPI) Number P51377 rev B, dated 16 APR 2014 and SPI Number P51551, rev A, dated 19 APR 2012.

3. A Certificate of Conformance (FAR 52.246-15) will be required for each delivery in lieu of a First Article Test (FAT).

4. This acquisition will use procedures for the procurement of Commercial Items in accordance with FAR Part 12.102(b).

5. Puregas, LLC. (CAGE: 06178), is the manufacturer of Part Number 51377 and 51551. These parts shall be procured competitively from Puregas, LLC., or from a contractor that distributes the parts, manufactured by Puregas, LLC.
