(c) Unitization: Shipments of identical items going to the same destination shall be palletized if they have a total cubic displacement of 50 cubic feet or more unless skids or other forklift handling features are included on the containers. Pallet loads must be stable, and to the greatest extent possible, provide a level top for ease of stacking. A palletized load shall be of a size to allow for placement of two loads high and wide in a conveyance. The weight capacity of the pallet must be adequate for the load. Foreign manufacturers shall have the heat treatment and marking of non-manufactured wood products verified in accordance with their National Plant Protection Organizations compliance program.

(f) These packaging requirements are intended to provide protection against environmentally induced corrosion and deterioration, physical and mechanical damage, and other forms of degradation during storage, multiple handling, and shipment associated with the military distribution system. The Government encourages contractors to submit requests for changes that will result in savings or improve the packaging. Please submit request for changes in accordance with the RFD clause of the contract. Government reserves the right to require testing to validate alternate industrial preservation methods, materials, blocking, bracing, cushioning, and packing at contractors expense.

Preservation Method modified as follows: Unit of Issue is "BOX" and the Unit of Measure is "10". The Quantity Per Unit Pack is 1 (one). In this case 1 (one) box. This means there are 10 filters in a box and the box is what is issued to the field. A single barrier bag conforming to Unit Container Code BL shall be placed around the 10 filters. Then place the bag in a box conforming to Unit Container Code ED.
