US ARMY CENTER OF MILITARY HISTORY  
MILITARY COLLECTION**

**1.0 Background**

The mission of the Museum Division, US Army Center of Military History, is to collect, preserve, and interpret historical material culture or artifacts, as stipulated in Federal Statute and Army Regulation (Army Regulation 870-20 Army Museums, Historical Artifacts, and Art [11 Jan 1999], Para 1-5a), which states: "The Army Historical Collection is part of the National Collection of the United States of America. The preservation for public use of historical objects of national significance for the inspiration and benefit of the people of the United States is governed by sections 431 through 433, and 470, title 16, United States Code (16 USC, 431-433, and 470), as amended." Section 1, 16 USC 461, further declares "that it is a national policy to preserve for public use...objects of national significance for the inspiration and benefit of the people of the United States." Section 1, 16 USC 470, states: "The historical and cultural foundations of the Nation should be preserved as a living part of our community life and development in order to give a sense of orientation to the American people....the preservation of this irreplaceable heritage is in the public interest so that its vital legacy

of cultural, educational, aesthetic, inspirational, economic, and energy benefits will be maintained and enriched for future generations of Americans...." Section 110 notes that "The heads of all Federal agencies shall assume responsibility for the preservation of historic properties which are owned or controlled by such agency." Finally, Section 301 of 470 defines "historic property" or historic resource" to mean "any...historic...object included in, or eligible for inclusion on the National Register, including artifacts, records, and material remains related to such a property or resource." Preservation of objects is then defined as identification, evaluation, recordation, documentation, curation, acquisition, protection, management, rehabilitation, conservation, and education and training...."

## **2.0 Scope**

This requirement is for the purchase of a large collection of military belt plates, swords, head gear and related materials, military canteens, artillery materials, firearms, bayonets, accoutrements, and musical instruments from the pre-Civil war era from the Nannos Collection as defined below.

(d) M1746 Restocked in North America, using the French lock & barrel note that there is no external bridle on the lock, pattern of 1746. Stocked on the lines of a Long Land Brown Bess.

(e) M1763 St. Etienne Mfg. Complete example of 1763 with the ramrod M1763 A Saint Etienne made musket retaining the original iron ramrod tube, found with its original M1763 pattern bayonet (found in New Haven Ct)

(f) M1766 This example is well marked with 6 surcharges, the barrel was originally made with bottom lug, Large US on lock, barrel, stock also found on the stock are I P, U. States, and a Federal US in an edged circle. Found in upstate NY.

(g) M1795 Miles Contract musket for Penna. troops, CP Markings as well as unit Markings/Regiment, etc.

(h) M1774 This example, with the United States brand and US on the lock and barrel has been scrubbed of French markings and had the swivels removed. There are other M1774 patterns with the States brand and metal Surcharges. This also has the IP on the stock.

(i) M1774 An example of one of the Federal period arms from Philadelphia using a French lock and barrel with Rev. surcharges and perhaps French bands. The stock is marked with the Phila. V and has a very unique and quality repair to the stock under the front band.

(j) M1728 A well used example of the standard French Musket. The only known example in a private or public collection with markings to the State of Delaware from the Revolution. The barrel is marked on the face: DEL. \* State N. C no 94 wood stock is branded with large DEL. STATE N.C. The State Arsenal, still standing, was in New Castle Delaware.

(k) M1757 Spanish musket & original bayonet (all original). Musket was found and obtained with its original Spanish bayonet

Document type means the type of payment request or receiving report available for creation in Wide Area WorkFlow (WAWF).

Local processing office (LPO) is the office responsible for payment certification when payment certification is done external to the entitlement system.

(b) Electronic invoicing. The WAWF system is the method to electronically process vendor payment requests and receiving reports, as authorized by DFARS 252.232-7003, Electronic Submission of Payment Requests and Receiving Reports.

(c) WAWF access. To access WAWF, the Contractor shall--

(1) Have a designated electronic business point of contact in the System for Award Management at <https://www.acquisition.gov>; and

(2) Be registered to use WAWF at <https://wawf.eb.mil/> following the step-by-step procedures for self-registration available at this Web site.

(e) WAWF methods of document submission. Document submissions may be via Web entry, Electronic Data Interchange, or File Transfer Protocol.
